



His Majesty the King granted a grand public audience on the balcony of Suddhaisavarya Prasad Hall in the Grand Palace at about 16.55 hr on 6 May 2019, as part of his coronation. On this occasion, Prime Minister General Prayut Chan-o-cha delivered a congratulatory statement.

They all waved to the people who waved the national flags and the yellow flags bearing the Royal Emblem on the Auspicious Occasion of the Coronation of King Rama X, while chanting "Long Live the
